

Ankeny School Bond Election Is Set for June 18: Ankeny voters will go to the polls June 18 to vote on a \$275,000 bond issue to finance a one-story addition to Ankeny High School. The building would connect the present junior high school building with the high school. (This addition is now Ankeny School District Administration offices located at 306 SW School St. The High School building referenced no longer stands. The Ankeny Historical Museum now fills the site.) The new structure would house a vocal music room, a band room, two classrooms, office space and an assembly room. *Ankeny Times, June 11, 1959* 

**Voters Approve High School Bond Issue 245:** Voters in Ankeny voted, 245-14, in favor of a \$275,000 bond issue to finance a one-story addition to Ankeny High School. Approval was well over the required 60 per cent majority. *Ankeny Times, June 125, 1959*

Vacation Bible School and Open House Held at Methodist Church: Ankeny Methodist Church School was a huge success with an average daily attendance of 146 pupils in the morning session and twenty-five Junior Highs in the afternoon. With a corps of twenty-five adult teachers and eight student helpers the theme "God, Through Work and Worship" was very thoroughly covered. On Thursday an open house was well attended by 225 parents and pupils. Punch, coffee, and cake was served in the Fellowship Hall under the direction of Mrs. Perry Brazelton, chairman. #### **New Traffic Laws effective in Iowa:**

- Day Speed Limits; 70 on primary highways, 60 on secondary roads, 75 on the interstate.
- Night Speed Limits: 60 on primary highways, 50 on secondary roads, 65 on the interstate.
- Minimum speed limit on the Interstate- 40 m.p.h
- Radar Warning: With the new daytime speed limits, the Iowa State Patrol will use radar speed
  detectors during the daylight hours. Patrol aircraft will assist in speed enforcement. Obey the law
  and live. Iowa Department of Public Safety. Ankeny Times, June 25, 1959

Ankeny Food Market Robbed: About 10 a.m. Monday morning four strangers, a woman and three men, entered Ankeny By-Lo Food Market. After spending a few minutes in the store, they made a small purchase and departed. They also departed with a sack containing approximately \$50 and a metal box containing insurance papers. Two customers were in the store at the time the strangers entered- Mrs. Ray Pietz and Mrs. Wayne Chown, as well as the clerk, Mrs. Murl Blair, and the bookkeeper, Mrs. Norma Righi. Mrs. Righi, becoming suspicious of the strangers' actions, hurried to the Ankeny State Bank for deposit. Mrs. Rose Carzoli, co-owner of the store, was in the back room and knew nothing of the robbery until it was over. If it hadn't been for Mrs. Righi's alertness to the situation, the loss of money might have been much greater. *Ankeny Times, June 25, 1959*



McCleary to Bike Across Country. Bicycling across Iowa last summer wasn't enough for Norman McCleary. This summer he is taking on a trip across the United States. He left last week for a 4200-mile, 82-day trip which will take him from Yorktown, Virginia, through Berea, Kentucky on to Newton, Kansas, and Pueblo, Colorado and Missoula Montana to conclude at Reedsport, Oregon. This east-to-west trip is one of several sponsored by bike-centennial, Inc., a non-profit organization. Norman is an assistant for a group of ten riders who are taking the trip. They will average 50-60 miles per day over rural black-top or hard surfaces. Of the 4200 miles, only 18 will be on gravel roads. *Ankeny Press Citizen, June 24, 1976*





**Ankeny Administrators Salaries Upped** 10%. Salaries for Ankeny School District administrators will be raised an average of 10% for the coming school year. And the individual raises are running from 7.1% to 12.5%. Level 1 (Athletic Director, Jr. High Vice-Principal, Business Manager) from beginning \$19,000 to \$20,000 to \$21,000 to maximum of \$22,000. Level II (Elementary Principal, Sr. High Vice-Principal) from beginning \$20,500 to \$21,500 to \$22,500 to maximum of \$23,500. Level III (Jr. High Principal) from beginning \$22,000 to \$23,000 to \$24,000 to maximum \$25,000. Level IV (Sr. High Principal) From beginning \$23,500 to \$25,450 to \$25,500 to maximum \$26,500. Level V (Elementary and Secondary Directors) from beginning \$25,000 to \$26,000 to \$27,000 to maximum of \$28,000. Ankeny Press-Citizen, June 17, 1976

**City School Officials Discuss Common Problems, Plights** – Members of the Ankeny School Board and the Ankeny City Council put their collective heads together to hash over topics of mutual interest, the general theme being attracting city interest and city dollars for various plans and programs.

The items discussed were use of school property between Parkview and Terrace Schools; attaching a swimming pool to an Ankeny School; Community Education cooperation with the city kicking in \$9,000 toward 1984-85 funding towards the program; and re-establishing the police liaison officer at the high school. Driving their last school bus route, Russ and Dorothy Wisecup, drove their last school bus route last Friday afternoon. Russ and Dorothy, who have been school bus drivers here for 26 and 22 years respectively, were honored at a retirement dinner at Elwell's on May 10<sup>th</sup>. Dorothy was the first lady school bus driver in Ankeny. When Dorothy and Russ were hired as bus drivers for the school district, Ankeny had a population of only 1,800 people and three schools. Now Ankeny's school population is over twice what the entire town was at that time and there are twice as many bus drivers.

Russ says that one bus driving incident which stands out in his mind is the night when a bus with 13 children on it got stranded west of Ankeny in the midst of a blizzard. They sent me and four other drivers out to rescue them and we all ended up spending the night at a house near Polk City. *Ankeny Press-Citizen*, *June 5*, 1984
