Received Air Medal: Mrs. Lash: Recently your son, Staff Sergeant Billie Wheeler, was decorated with the Air Medal. It was an award made in recognition of courageous service to his combat organization, his fellow airmen, his home, and you. He was cited for his meritorious achievement while participating in an aerial flight over the west part of the Bismark Sea. Almost every hour of every day your son, and the sons of other American mothers, are doing just such things as that here in the Southwest Pacific.

I would like to tell you how genuinely proud I am to have such men in my command, and how gratified I am to know that young Americans with such courage and resourcefulness are fighting our country's battle against the aggressor nations. You, Mrs. Lash, have every reason to share that pride and gratification. Very Sincerely, Lt. General Kenny Commanding. *Ankeny Times, August 4, 1944*

Awarded Oak Leaf Cluster:

Harold L. Brooks, 21, husband of Mrs. Harold Brooks has been promoted to the grade of Technical Sergeant, it was announced by the 15th Army Air Force Headquarters. Harold has also been awarded a Bronze Oak Leaf Cluster. In the words of the citation, "Sgt. Brooks was awarded the cluster for meritorious achievement in aerial flight while participating in sustained operational activities against the enemy." A radio operator, Sgt. Brooks is a member of a Liberator bombardment group which has been bombing German held targets in Southern Europe. *Ankeny Times, August 4, 1944*

Birthday Reception at W.L. Wagner Home: Mr. W.L. Wagner, a life-long resident of Ankeny and vicinity was honored at his home in honor of his 80th birthday. Nearly 100 of his friends and family shared in the surprise celebration. The Ankeny Chamber of Commerce has a new look...a healthy, energetic appearance generated by many of our leading citizens once again taking a firm grip on Ankeny's "bootstrap" and pulling together. Nearly 40 members and guests were present as president, Jerry Fulton, called the meeting to order at 7:45 Tuesday evening, August 13. Jerry gave a brief resume of the special re-organization meeting and listed some of the new committees given birth at that time. One of these, a Welcoming Committee, is already in operation. Jack Wells, chairman of the Welcoming Committee, gave a brief but thorough presentation of what this committee will be doing in regard to new residents, and new business enterprises in the future. *Ankeny Press Citizen, August 22, 1963*

Scholarships. The girls each received a half scholarship of \$175 from the group, which is made up of members of Blue Cross and Blue Shield. Open Bidding for New Post Office in Ankeny. The Post Office Department will advertise for bids to build a new post office in Ankeny, Iowa, Congressman Neal Smith announced today. The new post office will be located on the southwest corner of 3rd and Pleasant Street, in Ankeny (currently, Ware's Appliances). The specifications call for an interior space of 3,746 sq. ft. along with a 540 sq. ft. platform. The parking area will contain 13,384 sq. ft. The department will sign a ten-year lease with five-year renewal options. The building will remain under private ownership with the owner paying local real estate taxes. Bids will be opened October 1st at the main post office in Des Moines. *Ankeny Press Citizen, August 12, 1965*



AHS Captures its 10th state championship

– The unranked Ankeny softball team proved something last week to the rest of the state. The Hawkettes showed that ratings are often meaningless. Ankeny captured its 10th state championship on Friday night at Fort Dodge with a 1-0 victory over West Des Moines Valley in eight innings. The 10th-ranked Tigers failed in their bid to win a consecutive title. Coach Dick Rasmussen said, "The girls just kept fighting. They never gave up." *Ankeny Press Citizen* – August 14, 1991

AFF approves local airport site – Gary Palmer, Chairman of the Polk County Aviation Authority, announced on Friday, August 2 that the Federal Aviation Administration has approved the Ankeny Airport Layout Plan for approximately ½ mile east of I-35 near Ankeny on Oralabor Road. The FAA gave specific approval of its site location and a favorable determination, according to Palmer. "Plans can now begin to acquire land and move forward with the project," he said. This will be an important development tool for Polk County.

The overall Airport Development Plan is estimated to cost \$10 million, with 90% participation from the FAA Aviation Trust Fund and 10% funding from the local Airport Authority. Grading at the airport site will begin next spring. "We expect to see planes landing in August or September of next year," said Palmer. *Ankeny Press Citizen, August 7, 1991*
